Eco-Match (Pty) Ltd

Company that needs waste material

IS Programme year of intervention: 2016 Waste stream: Construction and demolition waste

Summary of intervention

The Ekurhuleni Metropolitan Municipality partnered with Eco-Match (Ptv) Ltd to recycle the construction and demolition waste from the Simmer and Jack Landfill Site in Germiston, after the Gauteng Industrial Symbiosis Workshops.

Simmer and Jack Landfill Site falls under the Ekurhuleni Metropolitan Municipality. The waste recycled by Eco-Match is converted into fill material, road application and concrete stone.









Waste stream:

Construction and demolition waste



Waste diverted from landfill:

9 500 tonnes



Jobs created:

3 permanent jobs

3 temporary jobs



Landfill space: 20 000m³
